### Semester One Report

The Semester One Report will be issued on Thursday, 26 June.

### Term Two End of Term Prize

A proactive feature of our new Responsible Behaviour Plan for Students is the recognition of positive student attitudes and behaviours. Our staff are always looking to acknowledge Hilliard students for practising the You Can Do It traits of being **Organised**, showing **Resilience**, demonstrating **Confidence**, displaying **Persistence** or **Getting Along**. At Assembly on Tuesday, our Chaplain, Mrs Keen, advised that - **Butler House had won the Term Two prize**. Final results for Term Two were: Aston - 69%, Butler - 70.5%, Carlson - 56.5% and Rogers 60%.

The works to rectify the drainage issues around the Junior Playground and to replace the damaged soffall are almost complete. These works also included the installation of a retaining wall to divert storm water around the Junior Playground to prevent damage to the new soffall material in the future. # CURRICULUM MATTERS

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## NAIDOC Week at Hilliard State School - 14-18th July

NAIDOC Week celebrations are held across Australia each July to celebrate the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. It provides a great opportunity to participate in a range of activities and to support the local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community.

This year at Hilliard, we will have a series of events planned:

- Indigenous Games Monday 14/07/14 – Dwayne Clark from PCYC and Mrs Karen Loy will teach Year 2-7 a variety of Indigenous games.
- NAIDOC Parade Tuesday 15/07/14– Indigenous students in Years 3-7 dance on Parade. Dances and their families will share a sausage sizzle following the parade.
- MUFTI-DAY Tuesday (red, yellow and black colours) 15/07/14 – Gold coin donation – money collected will go to Murri Kids.
- Indigenous Games for Prep and Year 1 will be held on Thursday 17/07/14.

## Excursions

### Gold Rush Excursion – 16th July

Year 5 students will be attending an excursion with Eureka Excursions to learn about life in the Gold Rush. The excursion relates directly to the upcoming History unit on the Gold Rush. Year 5 students dig up the history of the gold rush in Australia – this fascinating period in our history begins with an interactive exploration of life on the goldfields. The Gold Rush excursion allows students to experience aspects of the life and conditions of a simulated gold field township of 1854 through role-plays, tent making, observations and mapping activities. Businesses are active, licences are bought, and gold is sought and exchanged.

### Pandanus Pathways, Indigiscapes – 17th & 18th July

Year 4 students will be attending an excursion organised through Moreton Bay Environmental Education Centre. The excursion relates directly to the upcoming History unit which explores first contact between white settlers and local Indigenous communities. It will also have relevance for the English, historical narrative unit.

The excursion follows the story of John Finnegan, Thomas Pamphlet, and Richard Parsons, sailors shipwrecked on Moreton Island. The sailors were rescued by the local Quandamooka people. These people showed the sailors how to survive by building shelter, making fire, locating bush tucker and fashioning tools and weapons. Through these very hands on experiences, students learn about this first contact.

### Small Town, Big History, Stradbroke Island - 29th and 30th July

Year 2 students will be attending an excursion organised through Moreton Bay Environmental Education Centre. The excursion relates directly to the upcoming History unit, 'Exploring my local community'.

The students take on the role of Super Sleuth. “On a dark and rainy morning, an old suitcase belonging to Professor Thistlebottom was found”. Brave, adventurous students are employed to find out more about the suitcase and the artefacts contained within. Students formulate questions about the artefact prior to embarking on their adventure to Stradbroke Island.

### [A Home for Hermit Crab – 22st or 24th July](#)

Year 1 students will be attending an excursion organised through Moreton Bay Environmental Education Centre. The excursion relates to their upcoming Biological Science unit - Living Things and their needs. It also has links to the Geography unit, caring for our environment. Students are presented with a hermit crab shell and asked to locate the habit that is most suited to its needs. As students visit various environments they decide on the best environment for Hermit Crab and return his shell.

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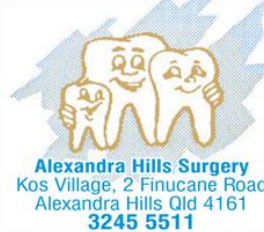
