



### **Student Goal Setting and Feedback**

Over the last fortnight, I have visited several teachers and classes to discuss how our teachers are developing Reading, Writing and Numeracy goals with students. Additionally, this visit provides teachers with an opportunity to share how they are providing specific feedback to students. Teachers also explain student progress towards goals and I then have a conversation with some students and ask them to advise me of their goals and how they are progressing to date.

The educational literature is strong in its support of student goal setting and feedback. Here is one example:

*‘Highly effective teachers are intentional about their teaching. Good teachers are clear about what they’re trying to teach and then master a broad repertoire of instructional strategies to help students accomplish their **learning goals**. They know not only what to do to support student learning but how, when and why to do it! (Bryan Goodwin 2011 p 19 “Simply Better – Doing What Matters Most To Change The Odds For Student Success”)*

### **Social Media and The School Community**

#### General Tips

Being aware of a few general strategies can help keep the use of social media positive and constructive:

- Before you post something online, ask yourself if the community or individual really needs to know. Is it relevant, positive and helpful?
- Remember that what you post online is a direct reflection of who you are. People will potentially form lasting opinions of you based on what you post online.
- Be a good role model. If things get heated online consider logging out and taking a few moments to relax and think. Hasty, emotive responses could inflame situations unnecessarily.
- Be mindful when commenting, try to keep general and avoid posting anything that could identify individuals.
- A few years ago parents may have discussed concerns or issues with their friends at the school gate. Today with the use of social media, online discussion between you and your close friends can very quickly be shared with a much wider audience, potentially far larger than intended.
- Taking a few moments to think about the content you are about to post could save upset, embarrassment and possible legal action.
- As a parent you have a role in supervising and regulating your child's online activities at home and its impact on the reputation and privacy of others. Parents are their child's first teachers - so they will learn online behaviours from you.

### [Year 5 Mentors and You Can Do It - Getting Along](#)

A large number of Year 5 students have been mentoring in the Prep to Year 2 playground areas over the past 4 weeks. This week, for the first time, Year 5 Mentors were provided with Getting Along awards to give to students who displayed this quality during playtime. Getting Along is an important part of the You Can Do It program at Hilliard SS. Here is some more detail around the Positive Habit of Getting Along:

#### **Positive Habits of the Mind that help develop Getting Along behavior in a young person include:**

- **Being Tolerant of Others**- accepting that everyone acts unfairly towards others some of the time, and not making overall judgments of people's character ("good person," "bad person") based on their differences or behavior.
- **Thinking First**- thinking that when someone treats me badly I need to think about different ways I can react, the consequences of each, and the impact of my actions on the other person's feelings.
- **Playing by the Rules**- thinking that by following important school and home rules, I will live in a better world where everyone's rights are protected.
- **Social Responsibility**- thinking that it's important to be caring, to try hard to do my best, to be fair to others, to make sure that everyone has the freedom to say what they think and feel without fear, to be honest and tell the truth, to have integrity by making sure that I do what I say I am going to do, to respect others and have nice manners, to act responsibly by making good choices, sorting out problems without fighting, caring about nature and other living things, and to be understanding and including others who are different.

## CURRICULUM MATTERS

### **ICAS Maths and English**

Maths and English competitions have been completed on the 12/08/14 and 29/07/14 respectively. Results are due back in approximately six weeks from the date of testing.

Once the ICAS test results have been released, students will receive a paper report through the school for each test they sat. The students' results may be viewed through an online facility. This provides interesting reports regarding the performance of your child. The advantage of accessing results online is that individual questions can be viewed. Parents will be notified of this as soon as reports become available.

### **Australian Mathematics Trust – Challenge Certificates**

Congratulations to the Year 4 students who took part in this year's Challenge Stage of the Mathematics Challenge for Young Australians (MCYA).

This week on parade the following students were awarded the listed achievements:

All participating students receive a certificate. In the Junior Division, certificates are Distinction, Credit, Proficiency and Participation. This is a problem-solving activity organised by the Australian Mathematics Trust which is aimed at the top 15% of students in their year level.

The MCYA Challenge Stage took place over three weeks in Term 2. Students received a problem booklet containing 4 problems. Students are required to present written solutions to as many of these problems as they could. The problems are challenging and required time and persistence, but were based on mathematics which should be known at that level. Students in the Junior and Intermediate levels may work with a partner on two of the problems. Individual solutions must be submitted.

### **Environmental Club – Tree Planting**

## WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY

### Chicken Pox

There has been a case of chicken pox (pending diagnosis) within the school. It is a highly contagious disease caused by the varicella-zoster virus. Please be aware of symptoms for Chicken Pox (varicella)

**Symptoms:** The disease starts with cold-like symptoms such as a mild fever, headache, runny nose and cough. A day or two later a rash begins, starting as small pink blotches but rapidly progresses to itchy blisters which usually last three to four days before drying out and turning into scabs.

**Transmission:** Chickenpox is spread through coughing, sneezing and direct contact with the fluid in the blisters of the rash. The dry scabs are not infectious. Since shingles blisters also contain the virus, a person who has never had chickenpox can become infected with chickenpox from someone who has shingles. An individual with chickenpox is infectious for about one to two days before the onset of the rash and until the blisters have all scabbed, usually four to five days. The usual time between contact with the virus and developing the illness is about 14 to 16 days.

**Treatment:** No specific treatment is recommended or required for otherwise healthy children and adults with chickenpox. It is important to try to prevent young children from scratching the rash as this can result in permanent scarring or secondary infection. To reduce the itchiness, try adding an anti-itch solution e.g. pinetarsol to frequent baths. ***Use paracetamol to lower temperature or to reduce discomfort. Asprin must not be given to young children and adolescents due to the risk of developing a severe condition called***

**Reyes Syndrome. This is particularly important for children who have or who may be developing chickenpox.**

**Control:** People with chickenpox should be excluded from childcare facilities, schools or work for at least five days after the rash first appears or until dry scabs have replaced all blisters. Any contacts with lowered immunity, such as those with leukaemia, should be immediately excluded and referred for specialist advice.

**Prevention:** Immunisation is the best way to protect against chickenpox. However, it is also important to maintain good hygiene practices, such as washing hands after blowing or wiping nose, after coughing and before preparing food or eating.
