Dear Parents

Welcome to Term Three.

Responsible Behaviour Plan for Students (RBPFS)

During the course of Semester One, our Hilliard Improvement Team has worked hard to review the existing RBPFS (August 2010) and to draft a new RBPFS. Our staff has provided feedback on the latest draft (Number 3), and I will be pleased to present Draft 4 of the RBPFS at **the next P and C meeting on Monday, 15 July**. Features of Draft 4 include the establishment of a Thinking Room and the introduction of an end of term house prize. **I encourage parents to attend the meeting to learn about the new draft and be informed of how our school will proactively and, where relevant, reactively deal with student behaviour.**

Athletics

Due to the wet conditions, our athletics carnivals were postponed on 11, 12 and 13 June. These events will now be held in Week Two of Term Three. Specifically, Field Events are scheduled for Tuesday, 16 July; Junior Athletics will occur on Wednesday, 17 July and Senior Athletics will be held on Thursday, 18 July.

Chaplaincy

Our Chaplain, Mrs Lyn Keen, currently works four days a week. Lyn provides a wonderful service of care and support to Hilliard students, staff and parents and plays an integral role in our school's Special Needs Action Committee. The Federal Government funds Lyn for two of her four days and our Local Chaplaincy Committee fundraises for the other two days.

To maintain the Federal Government financial support, it is necessary for our school community, via the P and C, to indicate its continued support of Chaplaincy. At the next P and C meeting on Monday, 15 July, I will be seeking our school community's continued support of Chaplaincy and minuting this to secure ongoing Federal Government financial support.

Staffing

A special welcome to Miss Hayley Goodacre (5C). Hayley will partner Mrs Kristy Barron for the first two weeks of term and then teach the class full time after that. We wish Kristy all the best for her maternity leave.

A special welcome also to Mrs Kerry Cottrell. Kerry will be teaching 4A for Semester 2.

Due to ill-health, Mrs Elizabeth Bass will not be returning to teach 1C.

Miss Chelsea Homewood will teach 1C for Semester 2. Welcome Chelsea.

Ms Emma Harris will resume teaching of 2B. Emma taught 2B in Term 1. We wish Mrs Melinda O'Keeffe all the best for her maternity leave.

Mrs Karen Beath is on long service leave until 17 July. Mrs Fiona Clews will be teaching 4C full time for this period.

This semester, our Teacher/Librarian, Mrs Jennifer Collie has reduced her teaching fraction from four days a week to two days a week. Jennifer will be at school on a Monday and Wednesday. Despite Jennifer's reduction in days, teachers are still welcome to visit and use the library with their class on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays and usual library operations will be maintained.

With the introduction of the new Australian History Curriculum, our school has made a decision to employ a teacher to plan, teach and assess History to Year 2 and Year 4 during Semester 2. Mrs Susan Elsmore will be performing this role on a Tuesday and Wednesday and supporting our composite classes on a Thursday.

I am also pleased to advise that Mrs Dee-Anne Edwards has been appointed permanently to the Deputy Principal position at our school. Congratulations Dee.

School Opinion Survey

The School Opinion Survey administration is to occur in the **week beginning 22 July 2013**. Each year, Education Queensland undertakes a survey of parents/caregivers, students and staff to gauge their satisfaction with important aspects of schooling. A limited number of parents are randomly selected to complete the survey.

Later in the year, the school will receive a report outlining the results of the survey for our school. The results will help the school to evaluate and to reflect on how well the school is going, and to identify areas for future development. The survey results are also an important part of the school's annual report. For these reasons, I hope you will complete the questionnaire and help make our school an even better place for your child(ren).

Mathletics use over the School Holidays

Over the school holiday period, Hilliard students were busy having fun I'm sure, but I noticed that many were accessing Mathletics and having fun and learning at the same time. During the 2 week period, 14 students achieved Silver certificates and 57 achieved Bronze certificates. I congratulate all students who continued to access Mathletics during the school holidays and also to the parents for your support.

At our most recent assembly, we awarded our second GOLD certificate to Scott B, and 27 Silver certificate recipients. Congratulations to these students. We also received correspondence from Mathletics, who recognised our Top Mathletics students at Hilliard State School. These students were awarded a specially recognised certificate from Mathletics. Congratulations to Isabella C (Yr2) who mastered 124 activities, Bree P (Yr4) who mastered 112 activities and Pearl H (Yr3) who mastered 99 activities. To master an activity, students must achieve a score equal to or greater than 85%.

Hilliard students have achieved close to 2000 Bronze certificates, over 250 Silver and 2 GOLD. Congratulations to all students who are using Mathletics to support their Maths learning.

iPads TIPS

There are more and more people buying iPads for home use and there are major benefits for both children and adults alike, from games, both educational and just for fun, to apps to support work, lifestyle and just everyday interest. I rarely pay for apps anymore and find that there are enough free ones out there to suffice my needs for home, work and play. AppsGoneFree is just one free app that provides a suite of free apps daily and there are often great ones to be had.

The mobility of the iPad allows the user to use it anywhere, anytime. Consider purchasing a wireless router and accessing the internet using your iPad (setup via Settings and WiFi). I am always amazed at the speed of page loads using the iPad when my laptop often has to have, what I consider, too much thinking time before loading. For websites that you access often, consider adding an icon to your iPad screen by touching on the rectangle with the right arrow and choosing to Add to Home Screen. You can even create a folder to place all of your website icons in. To create a folder, touch an icon until they all wobble and then hold your finger down on one and drag in on top of another. You can choose to rename the folder that you create.

CURRICULUM MATTERS

[Lexile Reading Framework to support reading development available for students in years 4-7](#)

Hilliard State School now has The Lexile Framework operating to support reading and comprehension development for students in Years 4 -7. The program will also be offered to identified Year 3 students.

[What is Lexile?](#)

A Lexile is a unit that measures the amount of challenge presented by a passage of text.

The Lexile Framework determines the difficulty of text as it looks at two factors:

1. The difficulty of the vocabulary (semantic difficulty)
2. The complexity of the sentences (syntactic complexity) throughout the entire book.

This information produces a numeric Lexile value ranging from 200-1200, used to match students with books at their Lexile level. This allows students to read at their 'target' level and offers sufficient challenge without frustration and promotes comprehension development.

[How Lexile operates](#)

Each student has been provided with a personal user name and login code to access the Lexile site www.mylexile.com.au . Students, under the guidance of their class teachers, have taken the initial Lexile Test to determine their personal Lexile reading range. Students then select and read books within their Lexile range. When students log into the Lexile site, it uses information about their Lexile, age and interests to provide an individualised reading list.

Hilliard State School library now has a designated area where the Lexile books are stored in their Lexile levels. This assists students to select books that match their Lexile range.

After reading, students test their comprehension by taking a computer Quiz specifically related to the book read. Each quiz consists of ten multiple-choice questions randomly chosen from a bank of thirty. After students complete the Quiz, they receive immediate feedback. Class teachers are able to monitor student progress through reports available on the Lexile site.

Students will take another Lexile test at the beginning of Term 4 as a measure of student improvement.

Students will be expected to read from the available Lexile titles as part of their regular home reading, and are encouraged to read for a minimum of 15 minutes per night.

WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY

Recently, there has been a case of Scabies reported within the school. The matter has been acted upon immediately, and medical treatment has commenced.

Scabies is a skin infestation with a mite called *Sarcoptes scabiei*. Symptoms may include itchy skin, often worse at night, after a hot shower or exercise. There may also be raised red lumps. Scratching may cause open sores, which may become infected.

Transmission may be passed from person to person through prolonged direct contact with infested skin. It may also transfer from clothes and bedclothes.

The mite does not transmit any infectious disease.

If you think your child may have any symptoms, please seek medical attention from your local doctor or health centre immediately.

Persons with infection: Exclude until the day after appropriate treatment has commenced.

Persons exposed to case with infection: Not excluded from school.


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
