2014 Program Charges and Voluntary Contribution

At the commencement of the 2014 school year, a note will be sent home regarding payment of charges for the Mathletics and Lexile programs that are run at Hilliard State School as well as a request for payment of our Voluntary Contribution. These fees are charged annually and enable our school to find additional funds to provide programs, tools and activities that your child benefits from throughout the year.

Cost for 2014 **Mathletics** will be approximately \$10 per student. This enables students to use the program both at school and at home.

Lexile for 2014 will cost \$7 per Year 3 student only. This entitles the student access to the program for as long as they are enrolled at Hilliard State School.

Voluntary Contribution: - These costs go directly to cover classroom costs including photocopying of classroom resources, supply of art equipment and materials, and supply of Information and Technology resources and internet usage. In 2014, the request for Voluntary contribution will remain at \$80 consistent with the 2013 request.

Our current 2013 P and C President, Secretary and Treasurer will be stepping down after many years of support to the Hilliard State School Community. We thank them for their dedication and support over very many years. Thank you to Mrs Karen Holmes, Mrs Janette Spicer and Mr Morris Fowke.

Hence, we will be commencing the search for new executive members to take the above positions in 2014. If you are interested in working closely with the school to achieve strong learning outcomes for our young people, I encourage you to have a chat with Karen or myself. We will welcome all enquiries.

2014 Student Medication

Parents, please be aware that any medication to be taken at school by a student must have:

- A completed Education Queensland Medical Form signed and submitted (available at the school office).
- A doctor's letter outlining the condition, medication, dosage and times and storage information
- Medication in the original chemist container/box with chemist label clearly attached.
- No medication (with the exception of an asthma puffer), may be kept with a student or in their school bags. All medication will be kept in a secured medicine cabinet.
- Exceptions: e.g. epi pens or similiar, will be discussed with Administration for the best outcome for student and the school community.
- Medical Alert Action Plans - If a student suffers asthma, epilepsy, diabetes etc. a completed Action Plan from the child's doctor/specialist should be supplied to the school.
- It is the responsibility of the student's parents/guardians to maintain stock of medication throughout the school year, advise of changes to a student's medical condition and changes to any medication (a new doctors letter outlining any changes will be required). It is also the parent/guardians repsonsibility to collect any medication at the end of the school year.
- At the start of each new school year, a new Education Queensland Medical Form, Doctor/Specialist letter and Chemist labelled medication will be required.

CURRICULUM MATTERS

North Stradbroke Island Trip – Year 4

Wednesday 13/11/13, Year 4 students went on excursion to North Stradbroke Island as part of their Science unit investigating erosion and History unit exploring changes since European arrival. According to all reports the student enjoyed their day and learnt plenty about aspects of their local community.

Yesterday, Year 4 from Hilliard State School travelled to North Stradbroke Island by barge. At 8:15am two buses came and picked Year 4 up to take to the barge. While we were on the barge (aka The Big Red Cat) we had our Munch and Crunch and after we were finished we were allowed to go exploring with our guardian. My group's guardian was Mrs Beath. We saw heaps of jellyfish. When we left the Big Red Cat the two buses separated. My bus went to the museum and the other went to Point Lookout. At the museum we met Elisabeth from our video chat. Some of the things I learnt were:

- That Dead Men's Beach got its name when two teenage boys went to the beach and found a skull and a boot.
- That a young boy and his dad went fishing, and caught a shark and brought it to shore. The young boy put a mullet in its mouth, but the shark didn't do anything so he went to get it out and the shark bit his hand.

Then a girl called Lisa told us some things and I learnt:

- The Dunwich Benevolent Asylum was a place where adults would go if they had no family or if they were disabled or very sick.

- The room we were in was called the “Foul Room”. There people would go if they had a bladder problem.
- There was a man called Henry rode a horse and took cattle from farm to farm. Henry’s horse stepped all over him and his right arm was disabled.

Then we were allowed free time and were allowed to look around the museum. After we went back on the bus, we went to Point Lookout at Main Beach for the Gorge walk. First we had our lunch then started our walk. The walk was tiring and long, we looked at the eroded rocks, some had cracks in them. We saw two types of animals while we were there, dolphins and lots of turtles. When we were finished the walk we went back on the bus to the cemetery, where we got to walk around and look at all of the graves. After ten minutes we had to go back to the barge. When we were on the barge we had our Big Lunch then we were allowed to wander around. We saw a lot of jellyfish and something that looked like a whale. Once we came off the barge we went back to school and went home.

This truly was the best school day of my life!!!!!!

Researchers from the University of Queensland are conducting research into parenting of children with type 1 diabetes.
