Student and parent social networking can at times become a school concern if discussions, postings, photographs or videos are inappropriate or derogatory in nature or when students, staff or community members are being discussed in a negative manner which impacts on their 'reputation' and/or the 'good order and management of the school' (in the Facebook Terms and Conditions, Section 4, point 5 states, "You will not use Facebook if you are under 13").

I encourage all parents and caregivers to be vigilant in this area for the welfare of our young people.

Musical News

Encourage reading!

Learning to read is a complex and multi-faceted progression of skill development. Latest research into reading development indicates six key developmental attributes underpin this process:

- Oral Language
- Comprehension

- Phonological Awareness
- Letter/Sound knowledge (also known as Phonics)
- Vocabulary
- Fluency

What is Fluency? Fluency is the ability to read a text accurately, quickly, and with expression. Fluency is important because it provides a bridge between knowing what each word says (decoding the print) and understanding what the words are telling us (comprehension).

Fluent readers:

- recognize words automatically
- group words quickly to help them gain meaning from what they read
- read aloud effortlessly and with expression (their reading sounds natural, as if they are speaking)
- recognize words and understand the information in the text at the same time.

Readers who have not yet developed fluency or are reading a text that is too difficult for them will read slowly, word by word. Their oral reading is choppy. Their understanding of the text is low.

Consider the times you have listened to your child read. Have you ever listened to them reading a challenging text? How much of the text did they understand when they were working so hard to figure out what the words actually said? Usually, comprehension (for any reader, adult or child) is lowered when reading more difficult texts because most of the brain's work (its cognitive load) is taken up with decoding and working out what each word actually is.

When teachers select texts for students to work with, they use a range of difficulty levels depending on what their teaching focus is. If they are working on developing fluency, the texts will usually be slightly easier to lighten the cognitive load and allow the text to 'flow' for the student. Fluency activities at school can involve regular re-reading of a text, repeated reading of a section of text, listening to stories being read by someone else, readers' theatre activities, reading texts that use rhyme and rhythm and let's not forget pure reading for pleasure. Many of these activities are able to be done at home too to reinforce reading fluency.

Listen to your child read their home reader or some of their library book out loud. Do they sound fluent? If the home reader or text is too hard for the child to be able to read it fluently, read the book with your child, consider changing it for a different book or else speak with your child's teacher about accessing texts at a level that will better build fluency.

Want a fluent reader? Read the same texts multiple times to build confidence. Read easier texts. Read parts of the text aloud with fluency for your children and model what good readers sound like

(remember to use expression! J) Listen to audiobooks e.g. on the iPad. Read for pleasure with your child and encourage them to read for pleasure.

Happy reading & remember “Kids Who Read Succeed!”

Exercise Induced Asthma

Parents please ensure you have discussed the need for ventolin with your child, especially if they suffer exercise induced asthma. Ventolin puffers should be kept on the student when necessary and all teachers aware of your child's medical condition. Please be aware that Crossing Country training has commenced in the upper school. Students in the lower school may also be preparing for fun run activities.

Medication: Parents and Carers - please be advised that any medication that is to be administered to a student during school hours must have a "Request to Administer Medication at School" form completed and either signed by a Doctor or have a Doctor's letter attached. Medication is to be stored at the school office in the correct chemist container and labelled with name of medication, dosage, times and any other relevant information. Forms are available at the school office.

Asthma medication and epi pens are the exception to the rule - please see the office for further details.

Medical Action Plans: Copies of Asthma, Epilepsy, Anaphalaxis, Diabetes etc. or any action plan prepared by an authorised Doctor, should be supplied to the school office for medical details to be recorded on the students file.

ALL MEDICAL FORMS ARE VALID FOR A PERIOD OF 12 MONTHS ONLY (new medical forms/doctor letters/ action plans are required at the beginning of each school year).

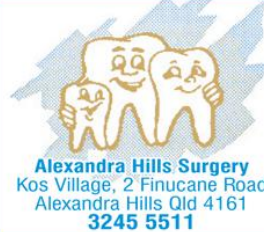
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
