**Under this agreement for 2017
Hilliard State School will receive**

\$256,257

This funding will be used to

- Increase percentage of students meeting NMS in Reading from 99% to 100% in Year 3 in 2017
- Increase percentage of students meeting NMS in Reading from 97% to 100% in Year 5 in 2017
- Increase the percentage of students in NAPLAN upper 2 bands in Reading from 36.7% to 42.0% for Year 3 in 2017
- Increase the percentage of students in NAPLAN upper 2 bands in Reading from 28.8% to 34.0% for Year 5 in 2017

Our initiatives include

- Continue implementation of student goal setting and feedback in Reading
- All students have an individual Reading goal based on HSS Reading Behaviours Continua
- Use a Reading Class Overview to differentiate student reading instruction, goal setting and feedback with students classified into Green (above average), Yellow (average) and Red (below average) groups for tracking and differentiation purposes
- Collaboratively developed 2017 HSS Reading Targets and Benchmarks document developed
- Management and Leadership Team working with a designated Year level for Reading
- Implement Hilliard SS Reading Program based on SER Big Six
- Provide quality Reading professional development for classroom teachers via Lee Denton (Literacy Solutions), HOC and Master Teacher

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Teacher Aides to support students during Guided Reading sessions (**\$85 257**)
- Release classroom Teachers for at least 60 minutes each week to implement student Reading goal setting and feedback, including employing a Technologies Teacher to provide release to further enhance our iLearn@HilliardSS iPad Program and provide our students with opportunities to engage in coding, programming and robotics (**\$120 000**)
- Employ STLAN (0.4) to implement Levelled Literacy Program (LLI) for identified students (**\$30 000**)
- Develop and implement Phonological Awareness and Phonics program (**\$21 000**)
